What subjects is it available for?	Divinity (German / English) German (DELC)
Language Requirements	German (minimum B2) The main language of instruction at the University of Tübingen is German, with some courses taught in English. We recommend students have B2 level German in order to access a full credit load of courses.

Application Process	If you are successfully allocated a space at this institution, SWAY will formally nominate you. The Eberhard Karls Universität Tübingen will then provide you with instructions on their application process.

Living

Estimated Cost of Living	Exchange students will be required to pay a non-waivable student services fee (currently around € 88 per semester) to the Studierendenwerk (governmental social service organization connected to German universities). The avergae cost of living for a student in Germany is approximately EUR 700-900 per month.
Accommodation	The student dormitories are not administered by the University, but by the so-called "Studierendenwerk", the Student Services Organization, which is not affiliated with the University.

Insurance	It is highly recommended for all EU citizens to obtain the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) or Global Health Insurance Card (GHIC) before their arrival.
Visas	Students should contact the relevant consulate / embassy to check if they will require a visa and a residence permit to study in Germany.
Disability	Some destinations may be more accessible than others for students with disabilities. If you require any adjustments due to a disability or specific learning difficulty and you wish to study abroad, there will be an opportunity to disclose this during the application process.
