# **Applications Steps**

#### STEP 1: Nomination

Student's name, email address and preferred campus (if known) need to be sent to <a href="mailto:studyabroad@massey.ac.nz">studyabroad@massey.ac.nz</a> by the home coordinator.

Students can apply for On-Campus Accommodation any time after nomination.

Applications open on 1 August for full year and semester one (of the following year) and 1 April for semester two (of the current year).

#### STEP 2: Application Submission

Documents need to be submitted to studyabroad@massey.ac.nz via email (preferably from the home coordinator).

#### Required documents:

- Study Abroad and Student Exchange Application
- Official Transcript
- Copy of the personal information page on the current/valid passport or birth certificate

Note: Additional documents will be requested if the applicant indicates they have a disability. Also the result of language proficiency test.

## STEP 3: Offer of Place

Upon receipt of the required documents, the application will be assessed, and an Offer of Place will be issued via the Massey University Student Portal. Instructions will be sent to the email address provided on the application form. Students should receive their Offer of Place within two weeks of submission of application documents.

### STEP 4: Payment of fees

If a fee payment is required, the amount and payment date will be outlined on the Offer of Place. A Receipt of Payment will be issued once the payment is confirmed.

#### <u>Student Exchange:</u> Studentsafe insurance fee

Study Abroad: (Independent): Full Programme fee, non-tuition fees and Studentsafe insurance fee

\*\*Study Abroad students coming through partner institutions will be charged differently according to the agreement.

#### STEP 5: Visa

Students are required to apply for a Student Visa through the Immigration New Zealand (INZ).

The Offer of Place and the Receipt of Payment are required documents for visa application.

Current INZ advice is to apply at least 3 months prior to the programme start day.
